IISRP ISSUES 2009 CHINESE SBR Market Report

Joint Work from IISRP and CNCIC

HOUSTON, TEXAS, 30 April 2010 —The International Institute of Synthetic Rubber Producers, Inc. (IISRP) has issued a report about the Styrene –Butadiene-Rubber (SBR) market in China. The report, prepared by China National Chemical Information Center (CNCIC), is collected in the “Elastomer Bulletin 03” jointly published by IISRP and CNCIC, according to Dr. Leon Loh, IISRP’s General Director of Programs.



This thirteen-page report details the SBR market by supply and demand in China. Chinese SBR demand reached more than 1.1 million tons in 2009, an increase of 21.4% versus the previous year. The data in this report includes supply, demand, import and export as well as future expansion projects. The SBR capacity was 1.0 million tons at the end of 2009. It is expected that additional 600 thousand tons of SBR will be added in the next decade. The report analyzes the impact of the United States tire anti-dumping policy as well as the 2010 Chinese SBR market.
